
Flexibilit

Definition - refers to the idea of acommodating change over time - housing that can adapt to the changing needs of users (Till & Schneider, 2005)


Types of flexibility


- Initial flexibility - allows the dweller participate actively in de design of its own house (N.J. Habraken, Sup ports).

- Permanent flexibility allows the dweller to change the house whenever he wants, by moving walls and even adding more surface if necessary.


















## RESULT

The Nemausus social housing project has, since it was completed in 1987, become so well know that it is difficult to put its radical qualities into proper perspective.
