CHARACTERISTICS RAMBLA RAVAL

THEN

The Raval was known for its immigrants and homeless people.

Rambla Raval was designed in 1999/2000 by Carles Diaz, Xavier Sust, Oscar Tusquets and Lluís Clotet to give the Raval more qualities by expanding the space in the neighborhood and to connect the seaside of Barcelona to the university area. Five blocks with 62 buildings were destroyed.

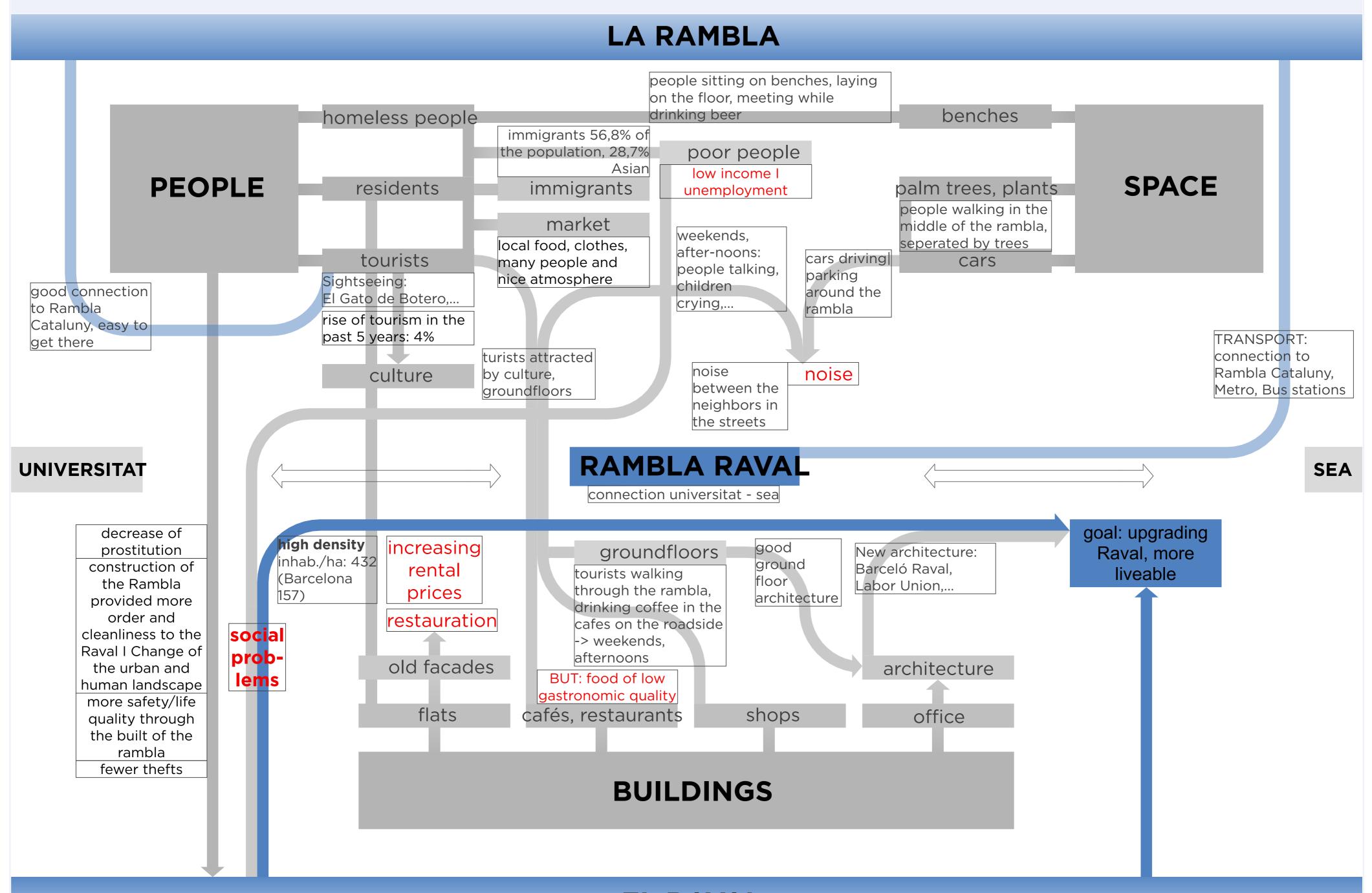
NOW

Place where people can meet and walk through or escape from the narrowness of the neighboring streets. The pedestrians are seperated from the cars driving around the Rambla by palmtrees and plants.

New buildings were designed to support the upgrade of the Raval in the past 15 years, a characteristic artwork of the Rambla Raval is 'El Gato del Raval' which attracts many tourists.

- buildings are in a bad state, facades and flats have to be renovated
- homeless people in the streets and on the Rambla Raval
- noise of cars driving around the Rambla Raval
- low gastronomic level of the restaurants, cafés,...
- people of different social communities not finding together
 - -> tourists I homeless people I elderlys I families
- a lot of empty space in some days

- Benches used by drunkards, drug addicts and homeless people as a meetingpoint
- Bars and restaurants: food of low gastronomic quality
- Noise between the neighbours in the streets

 in Copenhagen



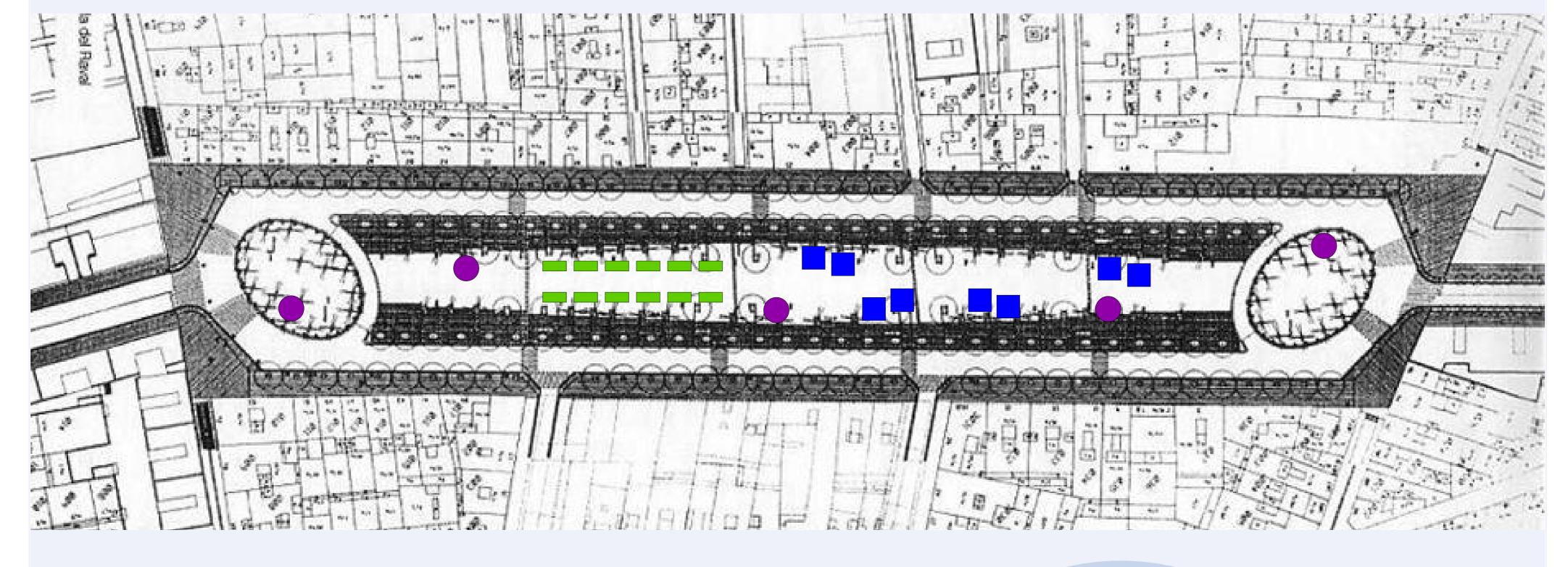
support local market

integrate cafés outside

- cafés outside the Rambla are in an exposed location to cars and riot
- goal: integrate them in the Rambla
 -> less noise from the cars
- more people will visit the cafés
 -> increasing sales volume
